Norcross, GA was named for former Atlanta Mayor Jonathan Norcross and was chartered as a town on October 26, 1870. In 2015, the estimated population was 16,634 and about 11.8% of families and 17.9% of the population were below the poverty line, including 20.0% of those under age 18 and 17.2% of those age 65 or over.
